### **ACHIEVEMENTS**



### Lived experience in commissioning

We developed and piloted a new model of bringing people with lived experience into the heart of local commissioning. In both Wandsworth and Barking and Dagenham the commissioners have accepted and tangibly acted on the recommendations from service users, including for example decommissioning a service and reallocating the funding.



### Cross-disciplinary research network on severe and multiple disadvantage

We established a ground-breaking cross-disciplinary research network on severe and multiple disadvantage bringing together academics from across different disciplines and sectors to see the whole person.



### Young adults in the criminal justice system

We worked with Police and Crime Commissioners to advocate for better responses to young adults in contact with the criminal justice system.

### **OUR POLICY WORK**



The Government committed to continued national roll out of Liaison and Diversion services across the country.

Revolving Doors has played a role as part of the Offender Health Collaborative in designing the operating model, supporting sites to do this work and providing the lived experience expertise to the national Programme Board.



The Home Secretary announced £15m of new funding to provide health-based alternatives

for the 4,000 people a year who spend time in detention in police cells under the Mental Health Act. Along with others, we have been active in calling for this change.



Review of drug treatment outcomes

Hosted a lived experience focus group on behalf of Public Health England as part of their review of drug treatment outcomes.
