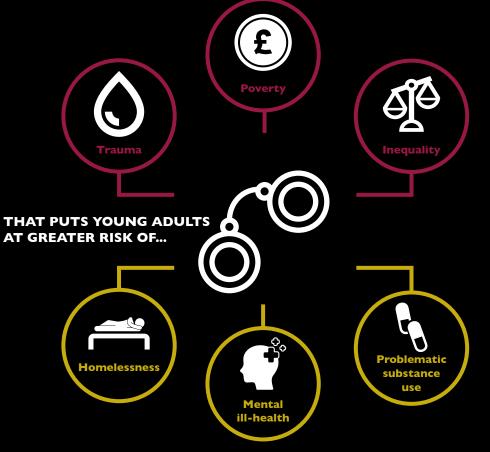
POLICE CAN DIVERT YOUNG ADULTS.

Stop arresting 18-25 year olds for minor crimes and divert them into support.

POLICE ARE NEEDLESSLY ARRESTING YOUNG ADULTS.

Every year 50,000 cautions or convictions are being handed to young adults, aged 18-25, for low-level and non-violent crimes like theft.

POLICE NEED TO TAKE A NEW APPROACH



DIVERTED YOUNG ADULTS COULD THRIVE.

The police already have the power to divert young adults into support, instead of arresting them, especially for non-violent and low-level crime. But too often they don't have services to divert them into. Vulnerable young adults who experience poverty, trauma and inequalities should be offered support to address their health and human needs. Investment in this new approach will reduce crime and support young adults to realise their potential.
